PURPOSE OF VISIT:

A Regional Malaria Coordinator visit to the province is part of The National Malaria Control Program with the Provincial Malaria Supervisor for the following;

1. Distribution of Malaria Commodities Rapid Diagnostic Tool Kits (RDT Test), Artemisinin Combined Therapy (ACTs) and Primaquine
2. Distribution of Long Insecticidal Treated nets LLINs for Antenatal Mothers
3. Conduct onsite training on Malaria Treatment Protocol (Update on New changes for Treatment, Treatment for Malaria in Pregnancy).
4. Ensure all Health facilities are correctly giving out Single dose Primaquine for PF cases
5. Collected Malaria Register Receipts and ANC receipts from Registers
6. Ensure that Health facilities are updating and maintain medical stock cards
7. Stock take of all Malaria commodities at Health facility level.

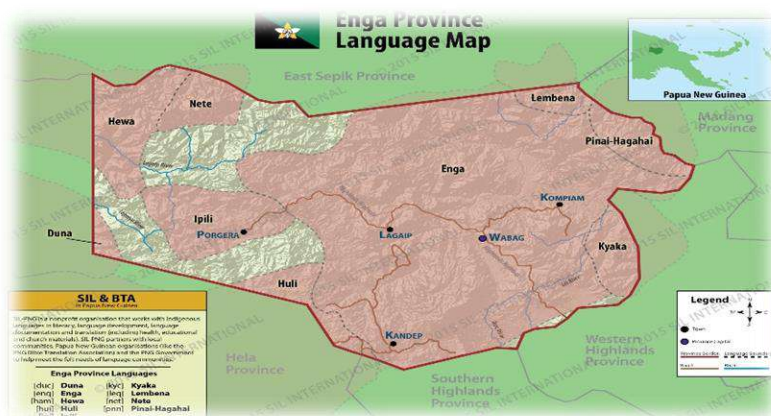
PLAN AND PREPARATION

A total of 10 days' plan was set for Enga trip to visit few accessible health facilities in Quarter (4) Four. However, the trip was executed within 9 days, we rescheduled whilst on ground due to Tribal warfare's in some areas in the province.



BRIEF SUMMARY BACKGROUND

Enga Province is one of the 7 Highlands province in Papua New Guinea and geographically situated in the northern region of Papua New Guinea, spans an area of 11,800 kilometers and has a population of 571,060 according to the 2021 census. The province comprises of six districts, Wapenamanda, Wabag, Kompiam, Porgera, Kandep and Laigam. It is the country's sixth most populace province and shares the boundaries with Western Highlands, Southern Highlands, Hela, West sepik and East Sepik Provinces.



MALARIA DRUG DISTRIBUTION

Full stock of Malaria Drugs was supplied by AMS – Mt Hagen. Total of 14 cartons received. 450 RDTs, 3 boxes of ACT 6, 36 boxes of ACT 12's, 50 boxes of ACT 24's and 300 PQ supplied.

- There were no major stock outs for the province after Quarter 3 distribution. No deliveries to facilities after Q3 Distributions.

DRUGS ROTATION TO EHP

- For this Quarter AMS supplied full quantified stock for Enga. After Q4 distribution we quantified for buffer stock and those HF's we did not visit and handed over to PHA under Epe Patricks care. Over stock supply was rotated to EHP.
- A total of 500 – RDTs, 18 ACT-12's and 24 ACT 24's was rotated to Goroka. And PMS Peter Kiwari received supplies.

STOCK CARDS

- We continue to remind staff to update stock cards and update stock cards in this visit.

ANTENATAL LLINs REPORT

- New stock of ANC nets delivered by RAM Logistics Team. 50 nets were sent from Lae up to Mt Hagen and received by PMS WHP_ Salome Minar.
- Later nets were collected by Rita Ephraim's and Enga PHA team from Mt Hagen to Enga and Store at the container at Transit store.
- Nets were later distributed by Epe Patrick under Rita's Supervision. A total of 50 nets distributed
- In Q4 we continue to distribute 300 nets.
- A total of 2350 nets left at the Container after Q4.

HEALTH FACILITY SUPERVISORY VISIT UPDATES

The total number of Reporting Health Facilities in Enga is 41. There are 33 accessible Health facilities and 8 are inaccessible. Of the 41 Health facilities 24 are government and while the other 17 are run by various Church agencies.

For this quarter we visited 8 out of the 33 of the accessible Health facilities, which is 24 % of the coverage of accessible health facilities.

Due to Tribal fights, we could not visit facilities in Kompiam, Kandep and Lagaip/Porgera. However, supplies are left with Assisting Officer Epe Patrick at PHA for OIC's to pick up.

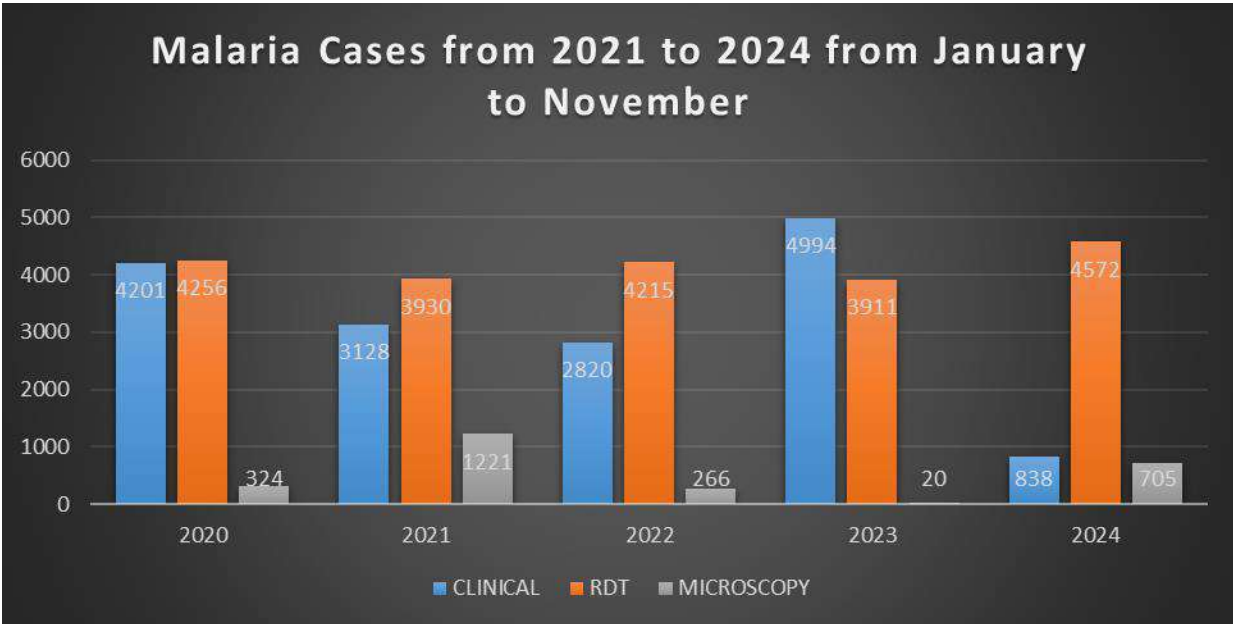

MALARIA SITUATION IN ENGA PROVINCE -2024

The Graph 1 below indicates Malaria cases reported through Clinical, Malaria RDT and Malaria Microscopy from January to November over the years from 2021 to 2024 (Data Extracted from eNHIS)



- Clinical cases have increased by 154 from our last report. However, we keep it low compared to other years. We continue to advocate and remind staffs during our visits PHIO continues to train staffs during visits and during end of month report submissions.
- We have more confirmed cases by RDTs for this year compared to other years. More facilities are aware and now able to record well RDTs done at the facility.
- Also we have more confirmed cases by Microscopy for this year compared to other years.

OVERALL CHALLENGES AND WAY FORWARD

1. Continuous tribal warfare in Districts thus making it hard for team to complete all HF visits.
 - **WAY FORWARD:** continue to engage PNGDF for security to high risk areas. At least prioritize to visit once in a year and run training to all staff. Also continue to update and equipped PHIO and Assisting Officers to fully understand the Malaria Treatment protocol and the correct reporting pathway so they carry on the work assisting and training staffs when they visit PHA office.
2. EPHA still has no No Permanent staff for PMS at the moment.
 - **WAY FORWARD:** During Q1, Q2 Q3 & Q4 visits PHA assigned Rita Ephraim's and in Q4 Epe Patrick to accompany RMC for visits. She has done a tremendous job in assisting with Malaria program we also hope PMS position should be filled sooner.

ACHIEVEMENTS

- This Quarter we managed to visit 8 HFs without any problems.
- Although due to short timeframe and Tribal fights in districts not visited we managed to cover facilities in other districts and with the assistance of PHA staff to continue assist to distribute to facilities.
- Most Facilities are using their emergency runs or pay runs to collect drugs or nets when they have stock out.
- Overall Malaria Reporting for the province has improved this year compared to other years as shown in the graph. More facilities are now aware of reporting well and they have improved in reporting on time with help of hardworking PHIO.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- We will continue to do On- Site training on Malaria treatment protocol and ensuring that Health Facilities are reporting well through NHIS.
- Aiming to do school survey in schools with the assistance from PHA.
